



FIGHT THE BITE: DON'T BE A MOSQUITO BREEDER

Mosquito Fact of the Month: Mosquitoes' life cycle, from egg to adult, takes about 8-10 days.

It is important for residents to do their part in preventing mosquitoes from breeding in their back yards. The best and most effective ways in doing so include: **Drain-** Remove all areas of standing water and change the water in pet dishes and birdbaths several times a week.

Mow- During the summer months, residents should mow their lawn weekly to prevent mosquitoes from resting and hiding in their backyards.

GRASS HEIGHT MAXIMUM: 10 INCHES

The maximum height for grass in Grand Prairie is 10 inches. It is unlawful for any person with ownership in a property in the City of Grand Prairie to have grass, weeds, rubbish or brush at a height greater than 10 inches, or for property to appear unsightly or unsanitary along, upon or across the sidewalk or street. Seven days after a property owner has been given notification of high grass, Code Compliance will issue citations and may have the property mowed. The resident will be billed and charged a \$150 administrative fee.


LIBRARY AUDIOBOOKS



FLOOD SAFETY

The City of Grand Prairie uses several tools to help keep residents informed and safe during flooding rain and storm events. One of these is through the city's Flood Warning System (FWS), which measures water levels at various creeks and channels around town and gives real-time updates on levels. These levels are used to alert first responders of high water so that actions can be taken to keep residents safe. The public can view data from these sensors by visiting gptx.onerain.com.

What is a flood warning? A flood WARNING means flooding is already occurring or will occur soon.

If you find yourself in an area under a flood warning, find safe shelter right away. Do not walk, swim, or drive through flood waters. Turn Around, Don't Drown! Always stay weather aware of flood watches and warnings in Grand Prairie.
