
SIGN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD UP FOR A BLOCK PARTY

ARE YOU A GRAND PRAIRIE TRAIL USER?

The Grand Prairie Police Department and the Parks, Arts & Recreation Department have collaborated to install 911 emergency signs along the city's two longest trail systems. These signs are now in place along the Fish Creek Linear Trail and the DFW Discovery Trail, which includes the Lone Star Trail, the Good Link Trail, and part of the trail system through Mike Lewis Park.



These emergency signs are designed to assist response teams in quickly locating emergencies on these trails. For even more precise location information, the What3Words app can be used. Download the app for free to ensure quick assistance in case of an emergency.

Placing these items out days before scheduled times causes litter to scatter, attracts animals and is aesthetically unpleasing. All garbage and recycling must be put out by 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day no earlier than 8 p.m. the night before your collection day.

Proof of residence in the form of a current water bill and driver's license is required.

Special Fee Information

We will accept automobile tires for a \$1 disposal fee. Disposal fees of \$5 or \$10 are required for larger tractor/ trailer tires - from residents only We accept computers, printers, and fax machines – from residents only

Construction and roofing material will be accepted from commercial businesses for \$40 per ton. (Contractors may not use this day to avoid paying Landfill fees). Call 972-237-8330 for more information.

Do you need to get rid of your unwanted tires? The Solid Waste and Recycling Department will be having a Tire Amnesty Week allowing Grand Prairie residents and small businesses to bring unwanted tires to the landfill for free. Space is limited and registration is required. There is a limit of 10 tires per household/ business. You must present a utility bill from the location the tires are coming from and a valid driver's license. Call 972-237-4562 if you have any questions about this event. New Fitness Courts

The City of Grand Prairie has partnered with the National Fitness Campaign to open free fitness courts across the city at: Tyre Park, Mi Familia Park, EpicCentral, Fish Creek Linear Park, Freedom Park, and Charley Taylor Park.

Each court features core, squat, push, lunge, pull, agility and bend zones and the courts are decorated by local artists. Construction is underway and the courts are scheduled to open by mid-October.

WHAT IS A PID (PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT) AND WHERE CAN I FIND PID MEETINGS?

A PID is a tool for neighborhoods to upgrade the appearance and maintenance of public areas. Funds from a special assessment paid by property owners are used to provide enhanced landscaping, signage, irrigation, entry features and perimeter fences. Improvements are determined by a resident advisory board, who are volunteers.

All PID meetings are open to the public, and everyone is welcome!
