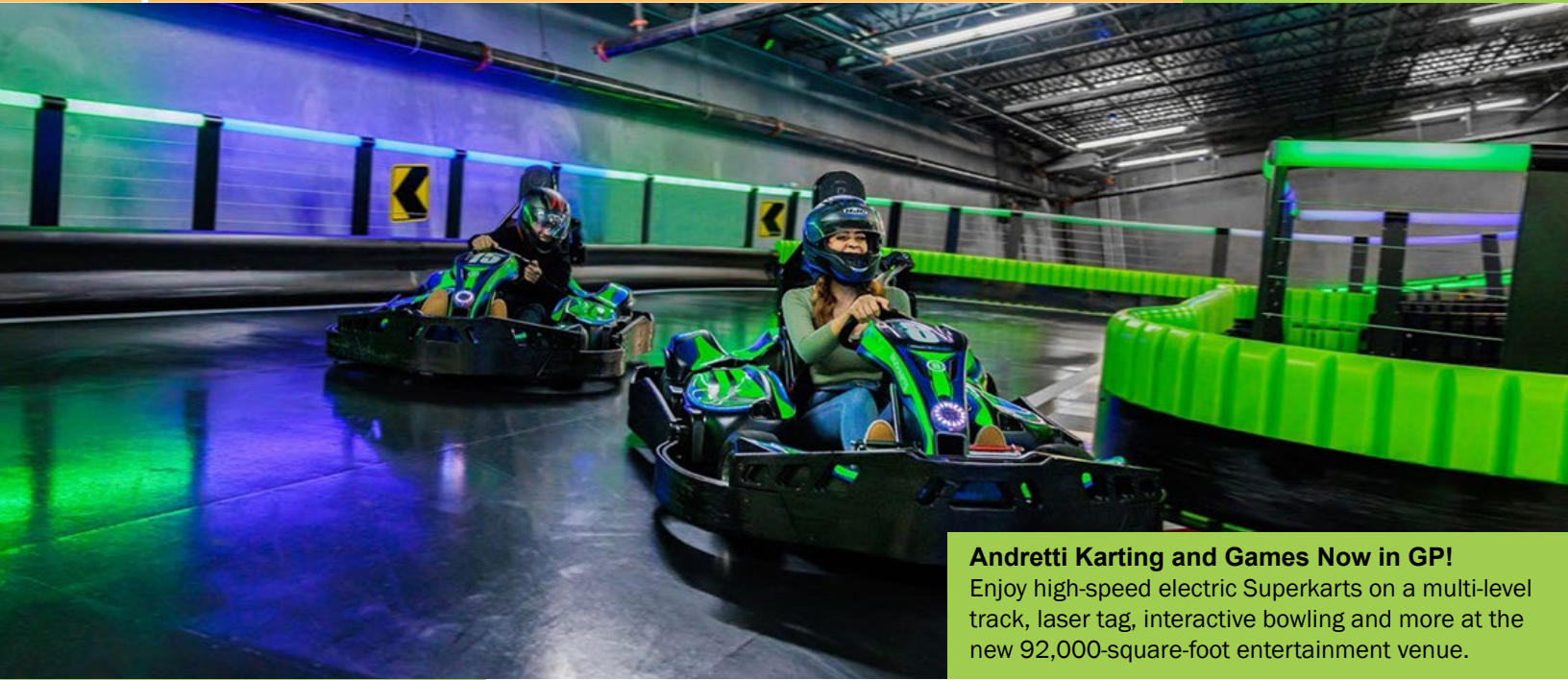

Message from the Manager

My Fellow Employees,

In an effort to *insure* you are well informed, and are not being fed false information through the rumor mill, I will be providing you an update, through multiple communication channels. I am doing this to insure you receive accurate information regarding the progress we are making to balance our FY24 and FY25 budgets.



As you may recall, sales tax revenue makes up 26 percent of our overall general fund budget and is one of our primary revenue sources. The City Manager's Office (CMO) and our Department Directors have been diligently working over the past weeks to balance this year's general fund budget by effectively reducing expenses in various ways. I am confident that with these measures and the higher-than-anticipated June sales tax receipts, it has helped us to balance the budget for FY 24. Please be aware that although positions that are vacated have been frozen, the CMO reviews and approves essential vacancies on a weekly basis to ensure we continue providing the world-class service our residents deserve.

As planning continues for our FY25 budget, we will keep operating more frugally, and continue to put safeguards in place to ensure we can, and will continue providing you, our fellow employees, with all that is needed to operate efficiently and effectively. While doing so, we will continue to do what is necessary to maintain a balanced FY24 budget, and achieve a balanced budget for the rapidly approaching FY25.

My priority remains each and every one of YOU. My goal is to continue keeping our finances stable, while supporting YOU, our work family, on a daily basis. I will continue to provide you with updates when warranted. By working together, we will tackle this challenge and come out an even stronger organization. Remember, as I have said previously, "GREAT CHALLENGES CREATE GREAT OPPORTUNITIES." Your dedication and hard work have created many opportunities for our city, and are what continue to make us make us a successful organization.
